THE EAST NEW YORK COMMUNITY CENTER (THE CENTER)

Currently operated by the NYPD, the Center is located at 127 Pennsylvania Avenue at the corner of Liberty Avenue, right on top of the Liberty Ave C train station and on the border of Cypress Hills, East New York and Brownsville. Newly renovated in 2016, the building houses classrooms, a computer lab, fitness center, dance studio, music room, indoor basketball courts and counseling space.

We'll work closely with local community-based organizations, service providers, libraries, senior centers, schools and small businesses to think big about the ways the Center can engage and inspire neighborhood youth, support a generative, supportive and collaborative relationship between police and community, and advance an innovative model of community-led safety and justice.

Community engagement findings will form the foundation of an innovative, integrated and actionable set of recommendations that address community needs and priorities and advance equity, justice and social resilience. Those recommendations will inform a Request for Proposals (RFP) for a non-profit that will run the Center and its programs in the future.

OUR GOAL

Our goal is to develop a bold, actionable plan that lays out a clear path to implementation and sets the tone for an innovative vision of community and youth development, public safety and NYPD/community relations.
